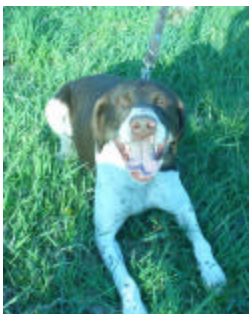
PAL PETS WAITING FOR A HOME.....

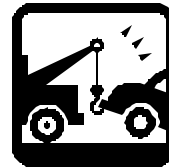

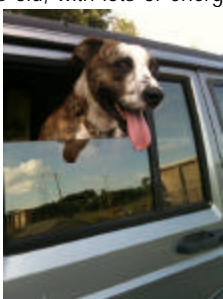
MORE PALPETS WAITING FOR A HOME

PLAN AHEAD FOR YOUR PET!

What if your pet outlives you? It seems like an unlikely scenario, but it could happen. No one plans on dying, but it is a fact of life. Most people have wills, or provisions to care for their children. But what about your pet? New Jersey, along with several other states, has adopted a specific law authorizing trusts for the care of domesticated animals, known commonly as a "Pet Trust." The benefit of having a Pet Trust is simply the peace of mind of knowing that the animal you love is going to be taken care of after you're gone; that money is set aside for this purpose and you won't have to rely on people who may, or may not, carry out your wishes. The Pet Trust is a legal mechanism that requires people to do certain things in a certain way. The Trustee your name will make sure that your money is being spent properly.

You should also choose a Caregiver for your pet. Your caregiver obviously is the key to successfully providing for your pet as you will want to find someone who is going to share your compassion for animals and be willing to care for your pet.

Also, something very useful to have on hand in your wallet is a Pet Emergency Card. If you are in an accident and unable to go home, who will care for your pet until you return? This card should give your home address; the name and phone number of your emergency contact person; and the name, phone number and address of your veterinarian. OCTOBER IS "ADOPT-A-SHELTER DOG" MONTH

Any month or time of year is a good time to adopt a shelter animal, but the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA) suggests that people looking for "their best friend" check out their local animal shelters.

However, before any big decision that will affect your life for many years to come, a potential adopter should research what kind of dog will fit their lifestyle. Are you ready for a long-term commitment? Many pets live up to 15 years of age or older – can you make this commitment? What kind of dog would best fit into your home? Do you have small children? Is your home safe and secure for the animal? Will the pet receive sufficient exercise and training? Can you afford a pet? Adoption is more than the adoption fee – there is food, pet supplies and vet bills to consider. If you can say "yes" to all of these questions, then please consider adopting a shelter dog.

Across the country there are millions of dogs entering shelters daily and many being euthanized. Due to the current economy their owners perhaps cannot afford them anymore due to loss of jobs and housing – perhaps they must move to a new apartment/house where pets are not welcome; perhaps the dog was not trained when first adopted and now has "behavior" issues; - usually through no fault of their own do most of these dogs find themselves abandoned, abused and confused.

There are many local shelters, shelters online and you will find them all full of wonderful dogs waiting for a new **leash on life!**

The PAL for Life Campaign was created several years ago to appeal to the community for those PAL pets that have had a difficult time finding homes. The sponsorship program consists of monthly or one-time donations made to help offset the cost of extended care. As unbelievable as it sounds, 12 week old kittens have been shunned because potential adopters felt they were already too old! "We want a KITTEN". Chronic problems, like teary-eyes, are often a turn-off to potential adopters; people always want perfection. But what people need to understand is that, just like people, dogs and cats are not always perfect. There is so much more to having a pet than worrying about perfection. Unconditional love, companionship, and the ability to provide for the needs of a disadvantaged pet are the true pleasures of pet adoption!

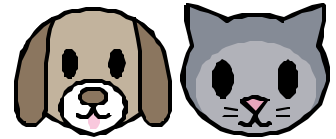

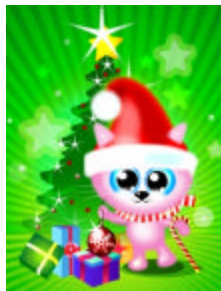
