Allamuchy Twp. & Pet Adoption League Work Together

The Pet Adoption League (PAL) began a Trap, Neuter & Release (TNR) program last year in Allamuchy Twp. with the help and support of the Township. In 2008, PAL helped over 150 cats, 90% of which had been abandoned in Allamuchy and were trying to survive after having lived in homes for some part of their lives.

PAL spayed, neutered, vaccinated and treated all of these cats and 144 of them were easily rehabilitated and very happy to be in the

Several of our volunteers worked with Big (his new name). It took a while but finally Big relaxed a little and trusted us to be able to touch the tip of his nose with a finger then slowly we could touch more. The time came (maybe a year) that he would not let us leave without touching him. One of the volunteers said "He would snag my sock to keep me a little longer to pet him".

In Big's foster home, he had a buddy named Dominick, who had been trapped in Allamuchy and was at the Pound for a while until PAL could afford to have him vetted and had a space for him in a foster home. Once Dominick was at his foster home he flourished. It was clear Dominick and Big got along with each other. Always bunking with each other as if sharing a good laugh or a good story.

Dominick's confident nature helped Big to become more confident. Once Dominick got to PetSmart they were put together in the large condo. Dominick acted as if he always lived there. Sure enough...in time a gentleman came to Petsmart...saw these two boys. He ran home all excited to tell his wife about the most amazing cats he has ever seen. His wife agreed to meet these amazing cats. She saw her husband's excitement at seeing them and she could not agree more. They had to have these two cats. The rest is happy history!!!!

Big and Dominick's new family update:

"The cats have gotten used to us and you're right -- Big always comes up to us for a scratch. Actually, he follows us around and comes when we call him ... it's almost like he thinks he's a dog -- I've caught him sleeping on his back with his legs in the air and he loves his belly rubbed ... strange, but cute! Dominick comes to us when he wants to, and when he does, he snuggles up to us for a belly rub as well. He actually seems to be closest to my 18 year old daughter because when she sits down; he jumps on her lap and lays down for some attention."

company of humans again. All 144 of these cats were adopted into loving homes. The remaining 6 were cats who wanted nothing to do with people, and after spaying and vaccinating them, we released them back to the places they were trapped so they could resume their lives without reproducing. Our volunteers are supporting the released cats daily with food and water, and shelters have been provided in these rural spots in Allamuchy.



We are very grateful to the Allamuchy Town Council for their financial support and foresight. Since the program began the township has stopped receiving calls about stray cats. Based on these results, we are very pleased to announce that Pet Adoption League and Allamuchy Township came together at the annual town meeting this year and renewed our contract to continue the Trap, Neuter and Release program.

DONATE YOUR CAR TO PAL


